# EXTENSION OF TERMS - ORDINANCE # 14-05 THE VILLAGE OF MORLEY ORDAINS

#### **SECTION 1: PURPOSE**

This ordinance is intended to extend the terms of office of the Morley Village Council, Mecosta County, to comply with the "Consolidated Election Laws of 2004 PA 286-300".

#### **SECTION 2: TRUSTEES**

Three of the village trustees shall be elected at each biennial village election for the term of four years and until their successors are qualified.

#### SECTION 2:A PRESIDENT

The village president shall be elected at each biennial village election for the term of two years and until his/her successor is qualified.

## **SECTION 3: ELECTION DATE**

The next regular election for the Village of Morley is November 7, 2006.

## **SECTION 4: TERM EXTENSION TRUSTEES**

Henry Petersen, term due to expire March 31, 2006, to be extended to December 31, 2006.

James Canfield, term due to expire March 31, 2006, to be extended to December 31, 2006.

Louise Kinney, term due to expire March 31, 2006, to be extended to December 31, 2006.

Ronald Irwin, term due to expire March 31, 2008, to be extended to December 31, 2008.

Philena Stine, term due to expire March 31, 2008, to be extended to December 31, 2008.

Kathleen Smith, term due to expire March 31, 2008, to be extended to December 31, 2008.

## **SECTION 4 A: TERM EXTENSION PRESIDENT**

The term of the following incumbent president shall be extended as indicated:

Johnnie Lewis Jr., term due to expire March 31, 2006, to be extended to December 31, 2006.

#### **SECTION 5: EFFECTIVE TERM DATE**

All terms will become effective the first day of the new year (January 1) following each biennial village election.

## SECTION 6: EFFECTIVE ORDINANCE DATE

Effective date shall be thirty (30) days following publication.
