Village of Morley Residents,

The Village will be busy this summer after the long year-plus pandemic. It was nice having the Memorial Day Parade this year, and it will be nice to have the Celebration on the Pond too (see page 2).

East and Fourth Streets have been chip sealed. Thank you for your patience with the road construction. We will be asking for more patience when Webster St. North, Fourth St. West, and Second, Deyo, and First Streets (East) will be paved—hopefully in July. We also had Third Street lines painted.

Our dam was inspected last year and some work is needed to be done. We are working with Prein & Newhof Engineering to develop a cost estimate and schedule for repairs. This will be a costly repair job and we're hoping there may be grants available to help us with it.

The Morley Pond is being treated again this year. Riparian owners were mailed a notice. If you would like more information about the treatments, please check out the Village's website, call the Village office, or stop by the outdoor kiosk by the office.

The Village of Morley was awarded a small grant from the Mecosta County Community Foundation to purchase playground equipment for Latimer Park (page 3). Please note: In 2017 the Village of Morley received bids from refuse companies in order to get a better rate on trash pickup. The requirement is that ALL residents must use that company if they are getting residential pickup. The company awarded the bid was Republic Services.

Village of Morley Clean-Up 2021 Begins April 1 and ends October 31

Leaves, Grass Cuttings, & Brush will be picked up April through October. On the **FIRST MONDAY** of each month brush will be collected. Please do not stack the brush too high (no more than 18 inches) and put the butt ends toward the road. On the **LAST MONDAY** of each month leaves will be collected. Yard waste must be in biodegradable/compostable bags (no regular plastic trash bags accepted). Brown paper yard waste bags and/or “Bag to Nature” 100% compostable plastic bags are available at Wal-Mart, Lowe’s, Menard’s, etc. Stack bags and brush at your curb. Please be considerate of our maintenance worker by loading bags that one person can easily carry. **PLEASE DO NOT BRING YOUR ITEMS TO THE MAINTENANCE BUILDING OR ANY OTHER VILLAGE SITE—VIOLATORS WILL BE PROSECUTED.**

Please Note: We will **NOT** be collecting your normal kitchen garbage and we will **NOT** be collecting “bulky” items, such as lawn chairs, furniture, appliances, etc. Because the Village has contracted with Republic Services so you can obtain rubbish service at a greatly reduced amount, these items can be collected by them (as long as you have obtained service through them).

No Hazardous Materials are accepted at any of the Cleanups: No Liquids, Paint, Concrete, Shingles, Tires, etc. are accepted. Mecosta County Household Hazardous Waste Collection will be Saturday, Oct. 9, 2021, 9 to noon, at the Mecosta County Fairgrounds, 540 West Ave., Big Rapids. As you walk around Morley or in your yards, please pick up any trash that has blown around. Let’s keep Morley beautiful!



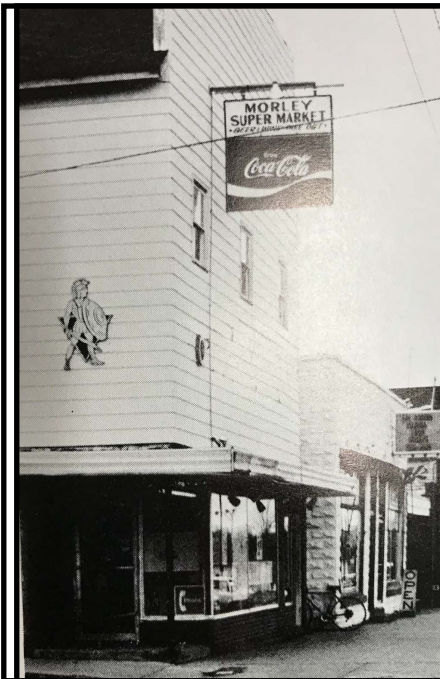
Road Rights-of-Way

Do you realize our Village streets are 66’ wide? No, the pavement does not extend the full 66 foot width but the road rights-of-way are actually that wide. Currently, in the Village, we have some obstructions in the rights-of-way that make it hard for our maintenance worker to plow and get around. These obstructions could be trash cans, fences, rocks, wood, etc. This year, on the streets being paved, it is very important to have these things off the rights-of-way. Would you please help us in keeping the rights-of-way clear?

Latimer Park Grant

The Village of Morley has recently been awarded a grant from the Mecosta County Community Foundation for \$3215 to purchase some new playground equipment for Latimer Park. Some of the old equipment was removed for safety reasons. This grant will not replace all the removed equipment but we will continue to seek monies for the playground.
